PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Seven years after the 9/11 tragedy shook our nation, the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund® continues to be a triumph over evil. I am very pleased to report that as of August 1, 2008, 950 students have received scholarship grants for postsecondary education for a total of \$27.3 million dollars. This is no small feat, and we owe the success of this program to you, our donors.

When the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund was conceived, developed and implemented, there was much that we didn't yet know. We didn't know the number of potential scholarship recipients, as defined by dependency on a victim of the 9/11 tragedy. We didn't know the federal government would create the Victim Compensation Fund, which provided some level of compensation to families for the lost wages of their loved ones who died. And we didn't know the tremendous response we would get from you, our donors, to our request for funds.

What we did know was that we needed to do something for the victims' families, we needed to do it quickly and we needed to do it equitably. As a result, our need-based scholarship program was born, promising an education would be within reach of every dependent of every person killed or permanently disabled as a result of 9/11. We deliberately decided to base awards according to need, so that those with the least family income and assets would have the same opportunities as those with the most.

Managing a scholarship fund like this one is not easy. Unlike a pension fund, which has a known number of beneficiaries set to receive known payouts, the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund has an unknown number of potential recipients with an unknown distribution amount. There are currently 4,088 individuals registered with the Fund—and this number continues to grow as eligible individuals learn about the fund and register.

Another big unknown is how much the cost to attend postsecondary education will increase between now and 2030.

To make sure we are managing \$100 million-plus in funds appropriately, we commission an actuarial study every year to help us determine the percentage of need payout required to a) make sure we have funds available for the youngest recipients, through Dec. 31, 2030 and b) make sure we spend every last dime of the funds on these dependents.

Scholarship America does not expect there to be any remaining funds at the conclusion of the program. To assure the utmost transparency in our management and sincerity of our intent regarding this critical scholarship fund, our board of trustees recently voted to voluntarily restrict the Board authority granted by the "Sunset Clause" (ninth paragraph) of the Fund Declaration. This amendment further narrows the use of any remaining funds to financially-needy dependents of those killed or disabled on September 11, 2001, and their descendants.

Scholarship America's leadership is also considering additional changes in day-to-day fund administration in an effort to assure that our constituents—families, recipients, and donors—receive the best information and service regarding the fund.

My son, Shawn, the younger of our two boys, attends Stevens Institute of Technology, a prestigious and wonderful school. Shawn is studying mechanical engineering, is a top student in the school, and is having a terrific experience. We are just so thankful that Scholarship America is helping us pay for his tuition, which we would never have been able to afford had it not been for Families of Freedom.

My husband, Paul, was a fireman who died during the attack on the World Trade Center. And although Paul has passed, we continue to have a wonderful family through the Fire Department. It was the Fire Department that told me about Families of Freedom and got me in touch with Scholarship America. Most of the children at the Fire Department are still so young that they have not had to use the scholarship yet, but my boys were in high school and finding a way to pay for college was very much in my mind.

Shawn has always been strong academically. At first he was very interested in music, but then during his junior year of high school, he started taking a lot of

physics classes and thought he would look into mechanical engineering. His father's job was a firefighter, but Paul was also a machinist and his first love had always been mechanics. Paul's father, his brother-in-law and his nephew are all mechanical engineers. And Paul, if he had gone to college, would have done the same thing. Paul was fortunate enough to be able to use his skills without going to four years of college.

MY STORY :: Eileen Cirri, and her daughters, Bianca, Francesca and Kara Jerez



I have three girls. My husband also had three children. We were like the Brady Bunch. Two of my daughters have the Families of Freedom Scholarship, the third is in the process of applying for hers. My husband, Bob, was a police officer. He was the only Lieutenant that died with the Port Authority during the World Trade Center attacks.

Even when my husband was alive, our family was strapped; we had a lot of bills and I never thought I would be able to afford law school, though it was always a dream of mine. When I received money from the Victim’s Compensation Fund, it had to stretch between all four of us, since the Fund does not cover stepchildren.

I met my husband while I was working in the ER as a nurse; he was a cop that brought me patients. While working in the ER, I saw injustices, like the dumping of patients, and I wanted to fight for their rights. Bob always told me I had the smarts to become a lawyer, but I never thought we could afford it and, to tell you the truth, I didn’t always believe I could do it. Plus, we would never take away the savings for the kids’ college.

I was probably one of the first spouses that took advantage of the Families of Freedom scholarship, as I went to law school in 2002. I know people hear rumors that the rescue workers got a lot of money, but they didn’t. Scholarship America was the only organization that allowed me, a spouse, to go to graduate school on a scholarship.

After taking the LSATs, I enrolled in Seton Hall Law School in 2002. But my mother passed away right after that. (She had moved in with me to help out with the children after Bob died.) It was tremendously hard, but I only missed one semester with my mother’s death. I just recently passed the bar.

I can’t thank Scholarship America and the Families of Freedom donors enough. I’ve always really wanted to do this and I’m extremely happy with my decision. Had I known how hard it was going to be physically, I’m not sure I would have done it. But I was always encouraged along the way, and now that I’m done, I don’t know what to think of it because it’s so new!

If I could talk to the donors who contributed to the Families of Freedom Fund, I would tell them that whatever they gave in any amount or in any form will never be forgotten. It will always be appreciated because it really did help this family. It was one of the more important needs that had to be addressed in our family, and Scholarship America was the only organization that had the foresight to think this far ahead.

Now people need to better themselves, and not just use it for their children’s education. It’s time for spouses to wake up and do something and go into whatever their niche may be. My own widow friends are all thinking of going back to school. Becoming a lawyer has been on my mind for the past 10 years, but a lot of spouses haven’t thought of it until now. We all need a fresh start, and Scholarship America is giving us a way to make that happen.

MY STORY :: Scott Beloten, former New York City Paramedic, permanently disabled



September 11 left me angry and depressed. Suffering from severe injuries and permanent disabilities, I started seeing a therapist, who recommended that I go back to school. I needed something for therapy, she said, and I had always wanted to graduate from college. I enrolled in classes at SUNY Old Westbury and thought about going for a degree in teaching. Eventually I realized I didn't have the patience for that, and instead I achieved my degree in Politics, Economics and Society, giving my mom her wish of seeing her son graduate from college.

When I enrolled in classes, I didn't even know the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund existed, but learning about it and receiving scholarship money has relieved a huge burden for our entire family.

As a father who doesn't feel like he has long to live because I am getting sicker as time goes on, it is extremely relieving to know that there's a safety net for the family when I die.

My wife won't have to worry about finding a way to pay for our children's college education. It's such a nice feeling knowing that Scholarship America and Families of Freedom is available to my children. They're only 13, 9 and 7 now, but it's comforting to know that when the time comes, my children will have college paid for.

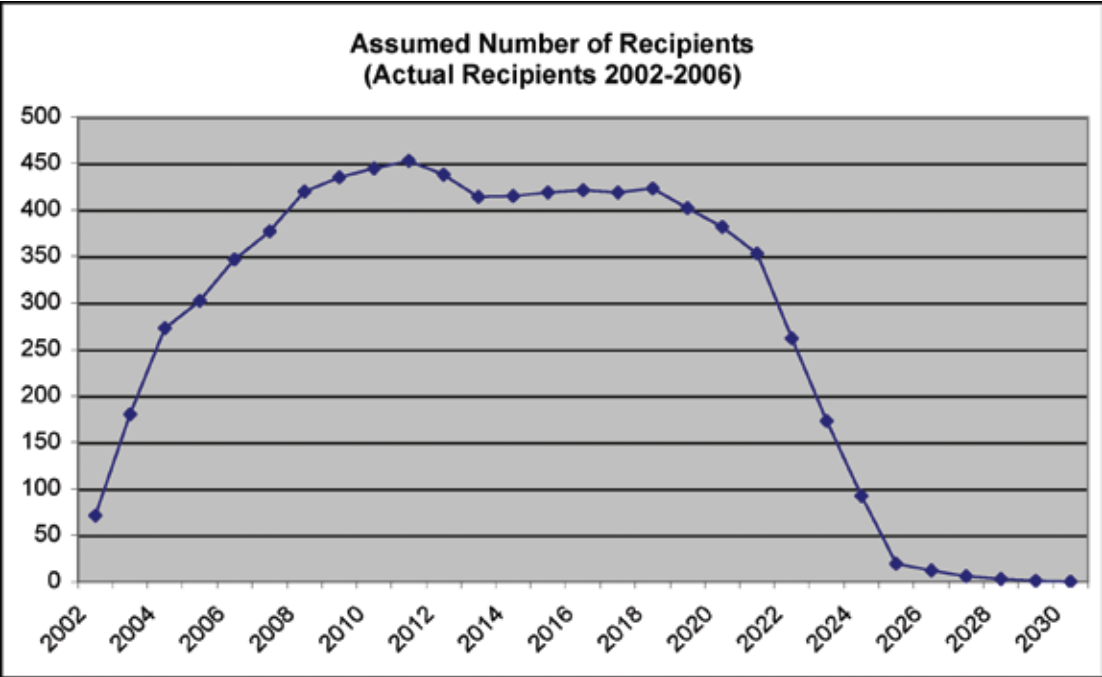
Looking Toward the Future

The Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund will continue to provide assistance until the year 2030, freeing 9/11 victims and their families from a major financial concern and reassuring thousands of students that anything is still possible.

PREDICTED NEED FOR FUTURE STUDENTS

- An estimated 4,500 students remain eligible for scholarship funds
- More than \$100 million is still available for scholarship distribution through 2030
- Between 2018 and 2022 alone, total scholarship needs are predicted to reach nearly \$80 million

FINANCIAL AID PEAK YEARS



The graph highlights the financial aid “bubble” of dependents of 9/11 victims anticipated during the next 15 years, peaking between the years 2009 and 2022.

Between 2009 and 2022, more than 400 students per year will demonstrate financial need and are projected to receive scholarships through the Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund.

Any assets remaining in the Fund or Governed Sub-funds as of December 31, 2030 will be dedicated to provide postsecondary scholarship assistance to the dependents of those killed or disabled on September 11, 2001, and their descendents, based on financial need.
